Course summary:

In the course, students are going to be acquainted with the basic principles, features, and topics of

ancient Egyptian art and iconography. The class will focus on the combination and arrangement of

figures and the organization of large walls in temples and tombs. In the main time the lectures will

train the students how to describe wall reliefs that contain different compositions in royal and

private monuments. During the class the students will be introduced to the evolution of the royal

reliefs and they will be encouraged to present seminar lecture on different topics and discuss over

the presented problems.

Key topics: Egyptian art and iconography in historical context (from Old Kingdom to Graeco-Roman

Period), Egyptian art and iconography in thematic context (from royal ideology to personal afterlife

beliefs), Egyptian art and iconography in social context (from the supra-elites to scribal schools and

graffiti).
